# Learning Scripture In The Year 1/2 Blue Classroom

#### Scripture: Psalm 50

We have been learning various ways that we *Proclaim God's Word*. We have been looking closely at the teachings of Jesus and the Apostles (Matthew 6:25-29,  $31\ God\ provides\ for\ us$ ).


We have learnt how important it is to trust in God and to live in faith and love.

We connected these teachings to our Liturgies and Masses, learning the various ways we pray and participate in *God's Word* during liturgical celebrations.

We have now come to the end of this unit where we have reflected upon the scripture of *Psalm 50*. We completed *Lectio Divina* and the children wrote down words that stood out as important to them.

We wrote these words down individually as well as adding them to a *chalk talk* display for added meaning. Afterwards we watched a visual clip about the wonder of God's creation.

We focused on feelings of gratitude and praise for creation. The children wrote their own describing words and added these to their *Lectio* words. The children then used their list of reflective words to create a **poem of Praise** of individual choice. This was a great link to poetry writing in English. We then presented our



poem in an artistic way using paint and shared our creations with the class. Some of us sang our poems as songs of praise to God. We made connections back to *Proclaiming God's Word.*

#### **2019 Sacramental Program**

Eucharist	Typically Year 3 Students	The children will receive the Sacrament of First Eucharist at Mass over the weekends of 14 <sup>th</sup> /15 <sup>th</sup> and 21 <sup>st</sup> /22 <sup>nd</sup> September.
