Staggered Afternoon pick-up

We will be returning to staggered afternoon pick up times as of tomorrow (3rd February) K-2 students and siblings will finish at 2.55pm.

Parents enter the school through the back gate and follow the fenceline, leading down under the hall via a path between our neighbour's fence and the hall.

You then follow the tape around underneath the hall to a pickup area. Students will be waiting in the middle. You then continue on back up the driveway and exit via the back gate.

Buses are running as normal.

Our goal setting meetings will still be taking place this term. Further information about this will come out later this week.

Mobile Phones

While we understand that some parents require their children to have mobile phones for security reasons, we would like to remind you all that they are not to be used at school. This includes phone watches for anything other than telling the time.

School Uniform

It is lovely to see all our students so well presented in their full school uniform. A reminder that all children should wear black leather shoes with their school uniform and not joggers please. Also, a reminder that children should not wear jewellery to school. Both for safety reasons and to eliminate the risk of children getting upset due to loss of valuable and special items.

Please keep Mr Brinley and Mrs Daniel in your thoughts and prayers. Sadly, over the school holidays they both experienced unexpected loss of a dear loved one in their immediate family. Also, for all those members in our community who remember or were taught by our ex colleague Mr Jerome McSweeney, please keep him your heart and minds as he is currently unwell and needs our prayers.

Covid Update

All other older grades (3-6) I respectfully ask that parents consider their child's needs carefully and if you can drop them at the gate, please do so without entering the school playground.




For quicker, hassle-free school payments, try Qkr! today

Our school will appear in 'Nearby Locations' if you're within 10kms of the school, or search for our school by name.


Step 4 Register your children

When first accessing our school you will be prompted to add a student profile for your child. This allows you to make orders and payments for them. If you have made a purchase you can select our school from 'Previous Location'




