## **COVID RESTRICTIONS LIFTED**

The easing of COVID-19 restrictions brings exciting news for schools this week, with parents and carers now able to enter the school grounds and attend school sporting events again, which in our case is very exciting for the upcoming Athletics Carnival on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> April where parent spectators and helpers will be most welcome. As we have now reached 50 days without community transmission in NSW, and the rollout of the vaccination program is under way, the NSW Government has recently eased restrictions across the state on the advice of NSW Health.

All school visitors assisting in activities or delivery of curriculum in class must continue to sign in via Compass in the office foyer, where they acknowledge that they will comply with the COVID-19 requirements. We will continue with similar protocols for parents and carers attending assemblies, where sign in via the QR Code is still essential and if you are needing to pick up your child earlier, we ask that you still come to the school office for collection of your child rather than going to their classroom.

# EARLY DEPARTURES OR LATE ARRIVALS

There appears to be a fair amount children leaving school early for unexplained reasons and sometimes for certain specialist classes or appointments (this does not include medical interventions such as OT, Speech etc.) on a regular basis, without Principal's leave granted.


Leaving school half an hour early one day a week equates to 300minutes a term, which is a whole day of school missed each term, equating to 4 days a year. If continued throughout a child's whole primary schooling years that would result in 28 days of missing school.

This is always a challenging topic to address but one that does require Principal's discretion to grant leave. Therefore, I do ask, if you have a child leaving early on a regular basis, you must write to the myself, the Principal to request permission to do so.

For further parent reference regarding this matter, I would like to refer to a section from the CSBB Procedures for the Management of Student Attendance.

### 12. STUDENTS ATTENDING PRIVATE LESSONS DURING SCHOOL HOURS

- 1.1 Involvement in private lessons, such as ballet and music classes that are conducted by outside agencies either on or off the school site during school hours, may not be conducive to the effective operation of the school or to the education of the student concerned. Student involvement in extra-curricular activities should be limited to outside school hours.
- 1.2 Where attendance at a private lesson during school hours is of exceptional importance such as sitting examinations, principals may use their discretion in justifying the absence. This provision must not be used on a regular basis. If the absence is justified by the principal, the principal can use code 'F' (if the absence is not included) or code 'L' (if the absence is to be included).
- 1.3 If parents withdraw their children from school for private lessons when permission to do so has been refused, an unjustified absence should be recorded (code 'A').
