EARLY DEPARTURES

- 3. Please avoid early collection between morning tea (10:45am 11:15am) and lunchtime hours (1:15pm 2:05pm). It is too hard to locate the children on the playground during their break times. If your early collection time falls between the break time, please try to do it as close as possible to the start or end of break time.
