## **Covid Regulations Updated 22<sup>nd</sup> April**

St Cecilia's continues to follow current COVID guidelines in applying the recommended safety measures. The main change that has occurred is that close contacts are now allowed on the school site but they must inform the school.

If you are a **close contact** attending school:

- inform the school via phone or email that you are a close contact.
- you should conduct a daily Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) and return a negative result each morning before attending school for 5 school days and possibly longer if further household members become positive.  
*\*If you have had COVID within the past 12 weeks of being identified as a close contact, you do not need to monitor with a daily RAT (see further notes in red below).*
- wear a mask if you are an adult entering the school grounds (*students who are close contacts are encouraged to wear masks*)

**If your child is unwell they should remain home and rest to get well. Rapid antigen tests can produce false-negative results and symptoms of other illnesses can also be similar to COVID-19, including flu, the common cold and stomach bugs. Health advice is that students or staff who are sick should always stay home to rest and recover and avoid putting other students and staff at risk of getting sick.**

If you **test positive** you are required to:

- record the positive RAT result through the [Service NSW website](#) or [Service NSW app](#) – there is NOW a prompt to add details of the students school or early childhood education centre
- notify your school of the positive RAT or PCR test result as soon as possible via phone or email.
- follow [NSW Health advice](#) to isolate for 7 days.
- administer a RAT prior to your child returning to school to ensure they are COVID negative.

**It is recommended that students and staff that return to school after recovering from COVID-19 do not participate in rapid antigen testing for 12 weeks following release from self-isolation unless they develop new COVID-19 symptoms.** This is due to NSW Health advice that people who have recovered from COVID-19 have a low risk of contracting it again in the following 12 weeks.

If your child has an allergy that presents with flu like symptoms, a medical certificate is required stating they are fit for school and suffer an allergy.

I will continue to inform the relevant grade when there is a positive case in the year group and guide families on NSW Health advice, including monitoring for symptoms.

## Awards Assembly

We will normally start assemblies at 2:35 but this week we will start a little earlier as we will also be distributing the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place getters for Cross Country. We look forward to seeing any parents or carers who can attend.

## Collaborative Coaching

As you may have read in the Term 2 letter from Danny Casey, our Director of School's (attached in last week's Principal Update), we have commenced our K-6 collaborative coaching program this term. The Towards 2025 strategic plan in Catholic Schools Broken Bay (CSBB) places strong focus on a culture of improvement focused on teaching and learning, which will be enhanced through the system-wide Collaborative Coaching Program.

*What does this mean for our school?*

The Assistant Principal (Mr Madigan) will facilitate weekly Collaborative Coaching sessions on a Monday and Tuesday with pairs of teachers from each grade. These sessions will run for an hour and they're an excellent opportunity to drive learning improvement through co-analysing, co-planning, acting on and reviewing of teaching and learning programs and student assessments.

Miss Phoebe Hayman and Mrs Claire Potter (now Mrs Garth) have been appointed as the Collaborative Coaching teacher release staff. This means that Miss Hayman and Mrs Garth will cover the teachers when they go out to coaching and under the guidance of the classroom teacher they will deliver teaching and learning of a specific subject area, including reporting and assessing in the area they will be teaching.

We were so fortunate to be able to secure these passionate and experienced casual teachers on a more permanent basis for the rest of the year. Both teachers are already known to the children so this will result in consistency for the children. Miss Hayman will always relieve the **Blue** class teachers for their hour of Collaborative Coaching and Mrs Garth will relieve the **Gold** classroom teachers.

Mr Madigan and myself will continue to keep you posted with our progress on Collaborative Coaching.
