MORNING TEA AND LUNCH TIME CHANGE

PARENTING TIPS 101

Just remember this one rule of parenting, its an absolute game changer.

The ratio should be 5:1 5 Positives to 1 Negative NOT THE OTHER WAY AROUND!

All kids thrive on positive interactions with their caregivers, surprisingly they don't wake up thinking of all the ways they can get into trouble or push our buttons and wear us down, that is not the desired outcome for them at all. They need support and encouragement and someone to praise them when they do the right things and hold them accountable when they don't. A child's value of self and what they think of themselves comes from positive interactions with their caregivers and from us delighting in who they are as a person, not from how well they do at sport or school etc to make the grades and have another trophy or medal on the shelf.

Every child needs to hear the good things they do and they need to be praised for the things they do right. Then they'll do more of the good things to get that feel good that helps to boost their self esteem and confidence. Building self esteem comes from the the parent/carers positive engagement with them.

If all we do is pick at them for all the things they do wrong, then why would they bother doing anything at all if we are NEVER happy with their efforts??

Keep a look out for all the little things and the big things they do well and praise them for it. Then if you need to focus on anything negative, the child's cup will be full enough to accept the criticism, listen to it and take it onboard. Its really easy to be on their back and all they hear is what they're constantly doing wrong.

Turn it around and find good things to praise them for and watch you child become more compliant, blossom within themselves and grow in to secure adults with good self esteem.

Raise them to know you are their BIGGEST FAN because one day your children will be raising your grandchildren.
