Year Two Curriculum Overview – Term Three, 2022

	Below is a summary of the content to be covered in each Key Learning Area in Term Three:
Religious Education	Caretakers of God's Garden (Weeks 1-5) Through developing an understanding of Jesus' ministry and exploration through prayer and scripture, students discover: • What is God's Garden? • What does it mean to be a caretaker? • Why should we be caretakers of God's Garden?
	How can we be caretakers of God's Garden? Jesus Shows Me How to Love /Jesus Our Friend (Weeks 6-10)
	Jesus' mission was centred upon bringing about the Kingdom of God in his world. All that he said and did was related to this purpose. Through this unit students will explore this concept. They will focus on:
	 How do we know love in our lives? What did the people of Jesus' time believe about how they should love? How did Jesus teach and show people how to love? How do we love as Jesus showed us?
	How does Jesus share his love through our friendships with others?
English	Work in English is done through independent, group and whole class activities. Reading: fluency and phrasing, comprehension strategies and decoding strategies Writing: grammar, punctuation and spelling with a text focus on speech writing. Speaking and Listening: This term the students will be preparing a speech in class and participate in a school-wide public speaking competition. Children also have frequent opportunities to share special news and findings from their inquiry research with the class. Modelled Reading: George's Marvellous Medicine by Roald Dahl
Mathematics	During Term Three, students will be exploring the following topics: Number & Algebra - Multiplication and division, whole number, money. Measurement & Geometry - 2D and 3D space, position, area, volume and capacity.
	Throughout the term, students will continue to work towards their place value goals. Opportunities for students to achieve their goal are integrated into the different phases of mathematics lessons.
Science	Inquiry Question: Which materials are right for the job? This science inquiry unit will allow students to learn about different materials. They will identify how materials can be combined and changed, and also that different materials can be used for specific purposes. The students will follow the inquiry learning cycle to research, collaborate and guide their learning.
PDHPE	Child Protection Unit 1 Through this unit, students will develop an understanding of appropriate and inappropriate physical, social and emotional interactions between themselves and those around them. They will recognise situations when they require support and assistance, and identify trusted sources of help.
	Sport Weeks 1-5: Gymnastics. Weeks 6-10: Games we love
Creative Arts	Through the forms of drawing, painting and printmaking the students will learn the techniques needed to create artworks integrating knowledge from the Science Inquiry Unit on Materials and there will be integration of the English modelled text, 'George's Marvellous Medicine' as inspiration and guidance for this terms visual artworks. Focus Artist: Children will be inspired by the connections and illustrations from our modelled text Illustrated by Quintin Blake (George's Marvellous Medicine by Roald Dahl)
	Students will also be preparing for the school musical in Dance, Drama and Music with Mrs Whyte.

They will be encouraged to use palm cards for prompting but will need to practise in order not to read their whole speech from the cards. Their speech delivery will be assessed in terms of reporting for end of year reports.

MATHS ONLINE - Maths Online tasks will focus on the topic area being taught at school that week. The set task is a consolidation task and should take no more than 10 mins to complete. It should not be new learning to your child so if it's appearing challenging for your child, please let us know via email or in the diary.

Optional - Wushka will also be accessible for your child, if they would like to access additional books to read.
