Parking Issue

Please note that the street parking across from the school office on Panonia Road is a Kiss and Drop zone. The parking outside the back school gate of a morning (not afternoon) is also a Kiss n' Drop Zone.

The Kiss and Drop Zone is an area near enough to

the school gates that it enables you to drop your child off safely and quickly. The intention is that *drivers do not wait in these zones, and they stay in the vehicle so that drop off is streamlined and traffic queues are minimised*. Maximum of 2 minutes in the kiss & drop zone.

St Cecilia's has limited car bays in the Kiss and Drop Zones, so please adhere to the road rules to be considerate of others wanting to utilise the Kiss and Drop Zone. If you want to walk your child out to the zebra crossing or to school, please find alternative parking to the Kiss and Drop zone e.g. Marathon St.
