Dear Families,

Last Friday, Miss Clancy and Year 6 planned a beautiful Remembrance Day liturgy, where we paused for a minute's silence in memory of Australians who have died or suffered in wars and armed conflicts. May we continue to hold in prayer, those who sacrificed so much for us, so that we may continue to enjoy the freedoms we have today. May we look to live our lives in a way that honours their sacrifice.

I can't believe we are only four and a bit weeks from finishing the 2022 school year, just six weeks shy of Christmas and then 2023 will be right around the corner before we know it.

This time of the year is always so busy with marked events in our own personal calendars and similarly in our school calendar. Our Year 5's have their leadership speeches starting tomorrow followed by their Bathurst camp next week, the K-2 Swimming Program due to start in week 8 (next week is week 7), we have our Stage 2 and Stage 3 Surf Safety days, the swimming carnival, our Christmas Concert and the End of Year Mass alongside the End of Year Awards with many more smaller events in between. END OF YEAR MASS incl. END OF YEAR AWARDS

Our End of Year Mass will take place on Monday 12th December starting at 9:30am. Following the mass, we will distribute our End of Year Awards. The teacher/s of each class will choose one student for each of the following awards.

- <u>Academic Progress</u> This award recognises a child who has made significant gain, growth or increasing proficiency along a continuum of learning in a specific learning area or across the board.
- St Cecilia's Creative Arts Award This award recognises a child's personal creative development, as an artist or art leader, building creativity, leadership and communication skills. The child who receives the Arts Award could be recognised in any area of the arts, including dance, drama, music or visual arts.
- <u>ACE (Attitude, Commitment, Effort) Award-</u> This child displays a positive attitude towards their learning, shows dedication and has given the best of their ability throughout the school year. Their strong work ethic has seen the child reach their potential and they have encouraged and enabled others to do the same.
- <u>Discipleship Award</u> This child follows the example of Jesus by helping others and leading a life
 of peace, joy and love. The child reflects Jesus' love and goodness to others by being good citizens,
 showing that they are productive and caring members of society, treating others with respect and
 they respect the environment.




