FREDRIC OZANAM AWARD

Separate to the End of Year school awards we gave out our annual *Blessed Frederic Ozanam Award for Commitment to Social Justice* is an initiative of the St Vincent de Paul Society in Sydney. It aims to recognise departing Year 6 students who have demonstrated a significant contribution and commitment to social justice and community service throughout their primary school years.

The award is named after the founder of the St Vincent de Paul Society, Blessed Frederic Ozanam, who at the young age of 20, not only gave much of his time to serve the poor but was also very active in striving for social justice through education and formation programs.

This special award was rewarded to **Beau Moore** and **Savannah O'Connor**. Congratulations to both children for their strong sense of justice for all and for demonstrating their commitment to community service. We are very proud of you both.

STEP UP MORNING

Today the children were given the opportunity to meet their new class teacher at step-up morning, taking place from 9am – 10:30am. Most of our new staff attended in person or via a Zoom or video to meet their 2023 class. from Monday 30th January – Wednesday 1st February. Kindergarten 2023 will have their first day of school on Thursday 2nd February.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

I would like to refer you to last week's <u>Principal Update</u> as a reminder for black, darker coloured or white sneakers (no high tops) to wear with Sport Uniform. *Children are not to wear brightly coloured sneakers.* Black leather shoes for normal uniform.

Jewellery – Children are only permitted to wear a watch and a cross on a chain, under their shirt. One plain stud or sleeper earring per ear.

Hair should be always neat and tidy and off the face. Girls with shoulder length hair or longer must tie it back with school uniform coloured hair ties or ribbons ONLY. Nail polish is <u>not</u> to be worn.
