SECOND STEP

Yesterday the whole staff participated in a three-hour workshop on *Supporting our Students with Social and Emotional Learning.* Part of the workshop included training to teach the Second Step program; a program which promotes social-emotional competence and self-regulation. It teaches skills that strengthen children's ability to learn, have empathy, manage emotions, and solve problems.

"Like any skill, self-regulation needs to be taught, practiced, and refined. Selfregulated learning is a process that assists children in managing their thoughts, behaviours, and emotions in order to successfully navigate their learning experiences." (Zumbrunn, Tadlock, & Roberts, 2011).

The Second Step program integrates Personal Development & Health curriculum outcomes and aligns with our Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) framework, which encourage our children to be safe, respectful, and cooperative learners. Please watch for the weekly Home Link task that will come home with your child each week to revise & discuss the in-class learning
