LATE ARRIVALS OR EARLY PICK-UP

The school office is naturally a busy place with many interruptions, however one of our biggest interruptions throughout the day is late arrivals and early pick-ups. SECOND STEP - WEEK 7

Kindy, and Year 6 are finishing up their <u>Skills for Learning</u> units around *Being Assertive* and all other grades are beginning on their <u>Empathy</u> units exploring *consideration of other's feelings as well as our own.*

Children are or have already learned that 'being assertive' involves using an assertive posture (face the person, head up and shoulders back) and tone of voice (calm, firm voice; respectful words). Assertive communication is the best way to ask for help. This help develop children's Self Management and Self Awareness personal and social capabilities.

Through the <u>Empathy</u> units, childre are developing Social Awareness by learning that it is possible to have more than one feeling at the same time. Being able to understand that others might have complex feelings is an important part of empathy. Others may also have different perspectives and being able to recognise someone else's perspective helps us get along with others. Please check in about these concepts at home with your children.
