
## EUCHARIST

I want to take a moment to express my heartfelt gratitude to each one of you who took the time and thought to complete my Principal Survey. The survey was only open for a week, and I had 59 parents respond and most staff. Your participation in this process has been immensely valuable, and I truly appreciate your dedication to our school community.

The feedback received from the survey has been very affirming and I thank you all for your heartfelt words. It was also encouraging to see that some of the identified areas for growth and development are shared concerns among staff and myself in a changing educational landscape nationwide. This alignment reinforces our shared commitment to continuous improvement of our school.

I want to assure you that we have already been actively working on addressing the identified areas for development, one which included a few mentions of *challenging student behaviours* that can impact on others. This is an area we take very seriously, and the school has been doing a lot in this space. In the past 12 months have reviewed our school Behaviour Guidelines including, the Behaviour Matrix and consequences, implemented Shine Awards (continuously reviewing), opened the Zen Den and Reflection Room, resourced playgrounds with new sporting equipment and we have introduced Restorative Practice as well as the Second Step teaching program. We believe we are already making many meaningful changes to increase positive outcomes for our students; however, we are in different phases of implementation for each strategy. Upon continuous review and consistent implementation, we believe all members of our school community, especially our children will benefit once all these things are embedded in implementation.

As we navigate any challenges together, please know that your support, feedback, and engagement are invaluable. Our collective efforts will undoubtedly lead to positive outcomes, creating the best learning environment for our children.
